From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

One of my favorite books is The Giving Tree by Shel Silverstein. It recounts the relationship between a boy and a tree.

"Once there was a tree...and she loved a little boy." So begins the beautifully written and illustrated story of unforgettable insight, by the gifted and versatile author. Every day the boy would come to the tree to eat her apples, swing from her branches, or slide down her trunk...and the tree was happy. But as the boy grew older, he began to want more from the tree, and the tree gave and gave until nothing was left, save a stump.

This is a tender story, tinged with sadness, radiant with consolation. Silverstein has created a moving parable for readers of all ages that offers a touching interpretation of the gift of giving and a serene acceptance of another's capacity to love in return. One last time, as an elderly man, the boy trudges back to the tree and the tree declares it has nothing left to give no apples for eating, no branches for swinging, no trunk for climbing. The boy acknowledges that the ravages of age have left him unable to eat, to swing, to climb and that all he needs is a quiet place to sit and rest. Straightening herself, the tree says that an old stump is good for sitting and resting and she invites the boy to do so. The boy did and the tree was happy.

The image of trees, is woven into the fabric of scripture. In fact, apart from God and people, the Bible mentions trees more than any other living thing. I look at the

trees in our yard, two especially, that An-Grace, mercy, and peace to you in the drea has designated as Arifa's Tree and Gregory's Tree. Each was planted about 14 years ago when a windstorm blew down some trees around our home. Each was only about 5 feet tall when they were planted and we were assured that they would not grow nearly as tall as the ones they were replacing. Well, now one has grown taller than its predecessor and the other is well on the way. Each tree has a ring around it denoting years of lots of sunshine and water and years when those elements were not as plentiful. Those rings are the trees' autobiography.

And what of us? What tells our autobiography? Isn't the tree a wonderful metaphor for our faith, especially a tree that gives? The psalmist talks about trees planted by streams of water.

The righteous will flourish like a palm tree, they will grow like a cedar of Lebanon:

¹³ planted in the house of the LORD, they will flourish in the courts of our God. ¹⁴ They will still bear fruit in old age, they will stay fresh and green, ¹⁵ proclaiming, "The Lord is upright; he is my Rock, and there is no wickedness Psalm 92.12-15 in him.'

May we each be a tree that flourishes in the courts of our God, still bearing fruit in our old age!
