From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Grace, mercy, and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

I was up at 5am the other day to feed Langston. He has this internal clock that lets him know when its time for breakfast, and dinner and the snacks that come between these meals. After breakfast, I let him out on the patio to run around the backyard, so he could let the whole world know he was there. As he did this, I turned on the television while waiting for him to let me know he was ready to come back into the house. Many stations were broadcasting the funeral for Queen Elizabeth II. I was drawn to watch for several reasons: 1) my father would have enjoyed the military pomp and precision on display; 2) the liturgy and the music were a balm for my spirit; and 3) the historical significance. I learned later that the entire celebration was planned quite some time ago.

I imagine that people of such stature as Queen Elizabeth II would have plans in readiness for the celebration of their life. I have heard that one of the first things the President-elect of the United States does is plan their funeral on the chance that they die in office. After all, there are so many details that need attention, protocols to follow, and people to be considered.

The idea of Queen Elizabeth II's service being planned years in advance leads me to thoughts about my own cele-

bration of life. It is a wonderful gift to our loved ones if we talk about the kind of service we want to have before we die. As the time led up to Andrea's surgery, we included as a topic of conversation what she would want in the service celebrating her life. Music (which is very important to her), scriptures, even the preacher were decided. I have planned the liturgy for my service and discussed it with Andrea. Acknowledging that death is inevitable, it is an incredible offering to sit with family and plan that service. As I have met with families where the loved one had left instructions, there is a tremendous sense of relief that the grieving process is not waylaid by trying to decide about music, scripture, readers and all the other parts of the Service of Death and Resurrec-

orical significance. I learned later that the entire celebration was planned quite ome time ago.

I invite you to think about how you would like to have your life celebrated when the time comes. Share your thoughts and ideas with your family, with me. Your gift of love will be a true reflection of the life you lived.


NIC ANNUAL CELEBRATION

CROP Hunger Walk - Sunday, October 16 at Cary UMC

The McHenry County Planning Team oversees the Church World Service CROP Hunger Walk for our county. Representatives from nine churches are working on this community-led interfaith event to raise funds to end hunger locally AND around the world. This nationwide Walk impacts more than 500 communities and 35 countries. Our county goal is to raise \$30,000.

On Sunday, October 16, walkers of all ages will step off from Cary United Methodist Church, 500 First Street, Cary, IL. They will follow a neighborhood route of a mile, 2 miles, or a combination of the routes for a longer walk. The library is available as a comfort stop along the way.

Walkers and teams will register starting at 1:30pm. Praise and prayer will be the send off at 2pm. The final step will be to create a meal bag with recipe for a family of four at our Easy Eats Station – the goal is 450 meals for the Cary Grove Food Pantry. Twenty-five percent of funds raised benefit food programs in McHenry County, and seventy-five percent of funds raised benefits Church World Service relief programs worldwide.


